Adoption Statement for the
Parking Standards Supplementary Planning Document,
January 2016

In accordance with Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that:

- The Parking Standards Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was adopted by the Cabinet of Milton Keynes Council on 11th January 2016 (see: <http://milton-keynes.cmis.uk.com/milton-keynes/Home.aspx>)
- Following consultation on the draft SPD some changes to the document were agreed by Cabinet on 11th January 2016. The changes agreed by Cabinet are set out in Annex to the Cabinet report on the above link. The Consultation Statement which is published separately to the SPD sets out the consultation that has been undertaken during the preparation of the SPD.
- Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the Supplementary Planning Document may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of that decision.
- Any such application must be made promptly and in any event not later than 3 months after the date on which the document was adopted.
- Under Regulation 14, this Statement is being sent to all persons who have asked to be notified of the adoption of the SPD.
