Adoption Statement

Milton Keynes Site Allocations Plan

This statement has been prepared in accordance with Regulations 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 and gives notice that Milton Keynes Council formally adopted the Milton Keynes Site Allocations Plan on **18 July 2018**.

The role of the Site Allocations Plan is to identify and allocate new, non-strategic development sites to provide short term flexibility and contingency to the existing housing land supply and to help deliver the Council's Core Strategy objectives, specifically to ensure that land for at least 28,000 homes will be provided by 2026. The Site Allocations Plan comprises 15 small and medium-sized sites, providing approximately 995 homes, throughout the Milton Keynes urban area which have been selected on the basis of their suitability for residential development and potential to support the wider Core Strategy objectives.

The Site Allocations Plan is not part of the (longer term) Plan:MK process. The Site Allocations Plan will cover the period until 2026, Plan:MK for the period until 2031.

Any person aggrieved by the Site Allocations Plan may make an application under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 to the High Court on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate powers and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made not later than the end of the period of six weeks starting on the date on which the Site Allocations Plan was adopted.

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
