

World War II Anderson Shelter Craft

Create a World War 2 Anderson Shelter using scrap materials



You will need:

- Large cardboard box
- Pair of scissors
- Coloured paper
- Pencils, felt tips & paint
- Corrugated cardboard
- Small square of foam/ old sponge
- Scraps of cloth
- Lolly sticks
- Scraps of string and wool
- Odds and ends

1. Place the large cardboard box on a table and cut off one side.
2. Place a piece of green wallpaper, green card or use green paint to create the grass.
3. The Anderson Shelter: Place a small box or square of foam in the corner. Glue shaped cardboard to each end. Glue a strip of corrugated cardboard over the top. To create sandbags at the Anderson Shelter entrance cut rectangles of scrap cream fabric, place small pieces of foam or cloth inside, fold over and glue down.
4. The washing line: Use 2 old lolly sticks and a piece of string / twine / wool to create a washing line. Cut out clothe shapes from old fabric and attach to the washing line.
5. Create a pathway and veg patch edging using small squares of brown paper or thin cardboard.
6. Create a veg patch in one corner, using felt scraps and wool.
