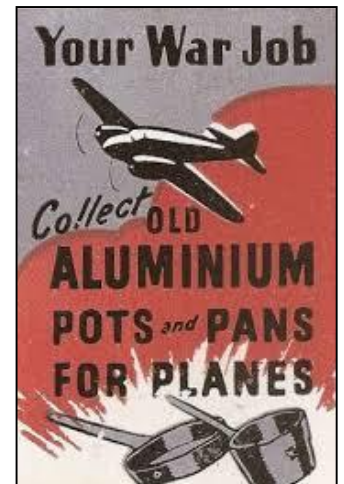
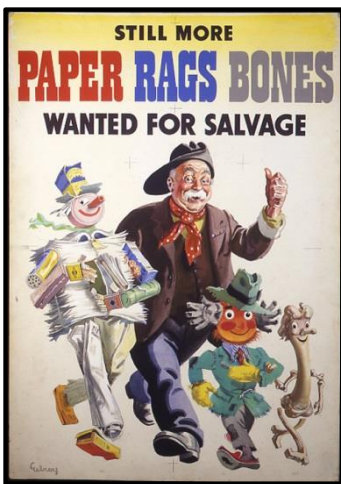


Create your own World War II Salvage Poster

During World War 2 the National Salvage Campaign was introduced to encourage the public to recycle to help the war effort.

Many colourful posters were created to help promote the various recycling campaign messages. There was even a scheme for children called, 'Cogs' where children were rewarded with a badge (similar to the Blue Peter Green badge today) for their help with recycling work done in their community.



Activity: Create a recycling poster in the World War 2 style, but with messages relevant to Milton Keynes residents today. This can be done digitally, hand-drawn or painted.

How:

1. Research the various World War 2 posters created by the National Salvage Campaign. Look at their slogans, colours, designs and consider which ones you think have the most impact.

3. Then create your own poster design with a current MK recycling message.
