

Make sure your EU importer is ready to receive your goods

- **Check your importer has an EU EORI number**
 - Your importer will need an EU EORI number
 - You'll need to get an EU EORI number if you're exporting to your own business within the EU. You can get one from the customs authority in any EU country

- **Check the rate of tax and duty for your goods**
 - Your importer will need to pay tax and duty on your goods after Brexit. This will depend on the classification of the goods.

- **Direct your importer to further HMG EU-facing communications**
 - HMG is running a programme of industry days and webinars across Europe to help importers understand the steps they need to take to continue trading with the UK.



Check what else you need to do for the goods you import/export

- **Depending on what you are importing or exporting, there might be other things you need to do to get your business ready.**
- **For example to:**
 - Change the labelling on your goods
 - Apply for licences and certificates
 - Find an approved Border Inspection Post where goods can enter the UK if importing, or the EU if exporting
 - Comply with special rules
- If you do not meet the requirements specific to your goods, your goods may be delayed or rejected when you import or export them.
