ORDER 2011) VARIATION ORDER 2020 (No.2)**

STATEMENT OF REASON

The Council of the Borough of Milton Keynes in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 intends to make the above traffic regulation Order.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to extend the no waiting at any time restrictions (double yellow lines) opposite the entrance to the Woodlands Business Park on the south-eastern side of Breckland in Linford Wood by 13.45 metres in a south-westerly direction.

The proposed no waiting at any time restriction will comply with the approved Section 278 Agreement, which will facilitate a new informal pedestrian crossing point on Breckland.

The proposed no waiting at any time restriction will ensure there is adequate visibility at the pedestrian crossing point and will help create a safer environment for pedestrians and cyclists.

The affected length of road has a speed limit of 30 mph imposed on it.

As the Highway Authority for the above lengths of road, Milton Keynes Council is satisfied that the introduction of the above proposed no waiting at any time restrictions will help encourage a safer environment throughout.

The Council's reasons for proposing the above Order are as follows:-

- 1) To maintain a safe environment throughout the road, particularly to encourage and facilitate pedestrian and cyclist movements on this road;
- 2) For avoiding danger to people or other traffic using the above roads, or any other road, or to prevent the likelihood of any such danger arising.
