VARIATION ORDER 2020**

The effect of the above notice and proposed Order will be to inform the general public that the Council intends to install a zebra crossing on Countess Way in Broughton and alter the existing 'no waiting at any time' restrictions.

The proposed zebra crossing comes as a result of safety concerns raised by residents and Councillors over the informal crossing facility at this location. The zebra crossing will formalise the crossing point and make it safer for pedestrians to the road.

The zebra crossing will encourage and facilitate safer pedestrian movements on Countess Way.

The proposed alterations to the existing 'no waiting at any time' restrictions will accommodate the proposed zebra crossing.

The Council considers it expedient to introduce the zebra crossing and alter the existing 'no waiting at any time' restrictions:

- to facilitate the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of pedestrians along the affected lengths of road;
- for avoiding danger to persons using the road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.
