Thank you for consulting me on the above planning application. Whilst I do not wish to object, I make the following comments in the interest of creating safe and accessible environments with minimal crime and disorder.

I would ask the applicant to be directed to SBD Commercial 2015 guide.

Access control

I would recommend Doorsets and access controls comply with SBD commercial 2015 standard.

Cycle

I can not see cycle parking details at this stage, ensure cycle parking on site is secured.

SBD Commercial 2015 Secure bicycle parking should be provided in view of an occupied industrial unit or warehouse with stands to which the bicycles can be secured. In order to encourage cycling to work and therefore reduce car journeys, it is recommended that the cycle parking provision is contained within a securable, roofed building. The building should be lit and secured during operating hours.

Lighting

Ensure the walkways are lit and lighting complies with BS 5489-1:2013 inc the site entrances and underpass.

Site entrance

Any pedestrian walk way into the site should be as wide as possible and landscaping shrubs trees should be kept to a minimum with maintenance considered along these routes.

The comments above are made on behalf of Thames Valley Police and relate to crime prevention design only.
