- 1. Implement the ten steps of the Charter Against Modern Slavery as agreed by Council in July 2018
- 2. Protect vulnerable people from exploitation and increasing awareness of and resilience against this crime by strengthen safeguarding processes
- 3. Reduce the harm caused by modern slavery through improved victim identification, support and intervention
- 4. Identify individuals and Organised Crime Groups involved in modern slavery, ensuring they are managed, prosecuted and disrupt individuals and groups responsible for modern slavery
- 5. Provide information to help professional and the public recognise and act on Modern Slavery
