

PUBLIC NOTICE

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL - PROPOSED TRAFFIC CALMING SCHEME ON CASTLETHORPE ROAD, HANSLOPE 2002

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Milton Keynes City Council proposes under Section 90A of the Highways Act 1980 to construct traffic calming measures consisting of four flat top speed humps on Castlethorpe Road in Hanslope.

The Councils reason for introducing the two flat top speed humps comes as a result of the new 101 plot housing development which will be accessed from Castlethorpe Road.

The two flat top speed humps will extend across the full width of the carriageway and will be located as follows:

- Speed Hump 1:** From a point 162 metres south of the centreline of Cuckoo Hill Rise, for a distance of 7 metres in a southerly direction
- Speed Hump 2:** From a point 254 metres south of the centreline of Cuckoo Hill Rise, for a distance of 7 metres in a southerly direction
- Speed Hump 3:** From a point 326 metres south of the centreline of Cuckoo Hill Rise, for a distance of 7 metres in a southerly direction
- Speed Hump 4:** From a point 406 metres south of the centreline of Cuckoo Hill Rise, for a distance of 7 metres in a southerly direction

The two flat top speed humps will be constructed of bituminous material or similar and will have a central lift of 100 millimetre.

Milton Keynes City Council is now serving formal notification on the proposed flat top speed humps and copies of the statement of reason and a plan showing the location of the speed humps may be inspected on the Council's website at: www.milton-keynes.gov.uk/consultations.

Any representations about or objections to the proposed flat top speed humps, together with the grounds upon which they are made, must be made in writing and sent to the Council's Traffic Regulation Order Team at Milton Keynes City Council, Civic Offices, 1 Saxon Gate East, Central Milton Keynes, MK9 3EJ, or by email to TROteam@milton-keynes.gov.uk quoting reference **NOT-043** and to be received no later than **6th October 2022**. Any representations received will be taken into consideration before the implementation of the scheme.
