Wheeled bins are coming!

MK is changing to wheeled bins for [waste and recycling collections in 2023](#). Since October 2020 almost 3,000 properties across MK have piloted the scheme, which has been very successful. Residents have reported a drop in litter and an increase in recycling. The new service has been formed using lessons learned here, as well as the 5,000 responses to the wider public consultation.

There are bin displays in all the libraries during October and in the coming months there will be information events and stands across MK to inform residents and answer any queries they may have.
