**ISSUES/COMMENTS** (including details of any consultations undertaken and any comments received)

Stoke Goldington Parish Council has decided to proceed with the preparation of a neighbourhood plan and wishes to designate its whole parish area as the neighbourhood area for that purpose.

Under the amendments made to the T&CP Neighbourhood Planning (General ) Regulations,2012 effected by the Neighbourhood Planning (General) and Development Management Procedure (Amendment) Regulations 2016, there is no longer a requirement to publicise area designation applications if the area specified in the application encompasses the entire Parish area. In such cases, the Regulations state that designations must be made as soon as possible, once the Authority is satisfied that the application is valid and complete. This is the case with the Stoke Goldington Parish Council application.

When determining an area application, the Council is required to consider how desirable it is to designate the whole of the Parish Area as a Neighbourhood Area; to maintain the existing boundaries of areas already designated as Neighbourhood Areas; and to consider whether it is appropriate to designate the area as a business area in accordance with Section 61G and H of the Town and Country Planning Act (TCPA) 1990.

Officers are satisfied that the Stoke Goldington Parish area represents a coherent, consistent and appropriate area for the purpose of neighbourhood planning. Whilst there may be a few small local business operations, the overriding character of the area is rural and residential and, consequently, it is not considered appropriate to designate the area as a business area under Section 61G of the Act.

It is therefore recommended that the neighbourhood area for Stoke Goldington is designated.
