




Population growth was second highest in SE

Median age increased by two years from 35 to 37






Younger population overall in MK compared to SE and England





Gender Identity on a Local Authority District and Neighbourhood level







Sexual Orientation: different level of detail on different geographical levels






Respondents identified as disabled and limited a lot decreased







Over 1 in 4 people were both in a country outside of England





Over 1 in 4 people in Milton Keynes' identify as an ethnic minority





Over a third of Milton Keynes' residents do not have a religious affiliation








Percentage of people above 16 in employment (Census)

Percentage of usual residents aged 16 years and over by economic activity status




Rate of employment (Annual Population Survey)





Decrease in home ownership while proportion in private rentals increased


