## The MK Sustainability Conference 2020

In early March 2020 the Milton Keynes Sustainability Conference took place at the Sky Room, Milton Keynes Gallery, 900 Midsummer Boulevard, Central Milton Keynes MK9 3QA.



The Conference delivered an overview of actions taking place in Milton Keynes Council to meet carbon reduction targets and deliver key messages:

- Use less fossil fuels.
- Find alternative ways to travel so we use the car less
- Increase biodiversity
- Build renewable energy capacity
- Work together to achieve carbon reduction targets

The keynote speaker for the Conference was the MK Council leader Peter Marland. Peter spoke in depth about our need to work together and ask ourselves *'what can I do to reduce carbon emissions?'*.
