### 1. Welcome & Introductions

MW welcomed everyone to the meeting and explained that while SH is taking a step back to cover the duties of a colleague whilst they take a sabbatical until October, she would be chairing the LERF meetings.

# 2. Minutes & Actions from the last meeting (9 March 2023)

• MW apologised for the lack of minutes from the March meeting. These will be sent out to attendees for comment as soon as possible.

### 3. Public Realm update

SG read out the update from Sue Brown, Principle Landscape Architect for MKCC.

"I don't have any news to share this month I'm afraid. We plan to install the planting at Burnmoor as soon as we have some wetter weather forecast, so this may slip to the autumn now. We are also mid handover of the Waste and Landscape Contract and so Serco are not taking on any new works. We will be back with the new landscape contractor in the Autumn to remover the old Lap equipment (very small play areas which are redundant) and carry out any additional works identified."

# 4. Regeneration Update

In WR and RM's absence, SG gave the following update:

"Good progress has been made on the work under the PCSA; MKCC is working through the detailed specification and pricing of the 40, or so, work packages and Graham are in the process of going out to a range of sub-contractors for getting pricing for these. MKCC cost consultants are meanwhile going through the specifications, to ensure that they are tuned, to get the best value for the Council; and, as prices come in, they are looking for opportunities to make savings, where possible. The objective now is to agree final figures with Grahams' for Phase A, by the end of 2023. Building works will then start, as soon as possible, following MKCC Cabinet approval in early 2024."

It was noted that SCSG, LERF and the RA are not always being kept informed or given the opportunity to comment on communications going out to residents from Grahams. **Action** 

• SG to raise this with the Development Manager.

## 5. Health and Well-Being Day – Friday 28<sup>th</sup> July

MW explained the LERF and the LOLRA are holding a joint Health and well-being day in July. SH is organizing all the stall holders who will be providing advice and support on health and well-being. While MW is arranging all the activities and refreshments.

SG reported that Cycle Saviours will be there to deliver a bike doctor session for residents who need their bike serviced and minor repairs carried out.

### 6. Bulk Waste Amnesty Day

MW explained that LERF is looking to hold another Bulky Waste Amnesty Day. SG has obtained two quotes for a staff caged vehicle to go around the estate. But more information around staff levels and availability are needed.

- Car park not big enough for 31 residents only 22. Shrubs over grown.

MW explained that LERF needed to agree some priorities for 2023.

It was agreed that the two priorities for the group would be:

  - Install 2 new benches on the man footpath through the estate, to encourage people to get out out about.
- Tackle fly-tipping & littering
  - Hold bulky waste amnesty day
  - Educate residents about the new wheelie bins

- SG to invite someone to come to Spotlight and talk about the new wheelie bins and explain the change to the collection day

# 8. Any Other Business

## New Wheelie Bins

• SG to email NH about which bits of the estate BFSTC would be responsible for from September and which bits MKCC would retain responsibility for.

JSP raised the issue of the drains in the car parks at the back of Serpentine Court flooding every time it rains.

# Action

• SG to contact the Asset team to arrange for them to be cleared.

# Rubbish/Fly Tipping

JG reported that there were approximately 11 black bin bags and other bits and pieces left on the corner of Skene Close by the bungalow.
