

The Covenant Duty

A **legal obligation** on certain public bodies to **have due regard** to the **principles** of the Armed Forces Covenant when carrying out **certain functions** in **healthcare**, **housing** and **education**.

For example: in healthcare, bodies such as the National
Health Service dealing with healthcare waiting list policies.

For example: in housing, bodies such as local dealing with the allocation.of.ocial.housing.

For example: in <u>education</u>, bodies such as <u>schools and</u> <u>academies</u> dealing with the <u>school's admissions criteria</u>.

The bodies subject to the Duty are expected to **consciously consider** the Covenant when **developing**, **delivering** and **reviewing policies** and **decisions** which may impact the **Armed Forces Community**.

It means placing appropriate weight on the Covenant principles when all relevant factors are considered.

It does <u>not</u> mean that any particular conclusions have to be reached or specific public service delivery outcomes achieved.
