Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse

Details: This free to attend training course will build your knowledge and confidence to recognise signs and indicators of Domestic Abuse. This course will be of interest to those wishing to learn more about recognising Domestic Abuse. You must be working within Bedfordshire.

What can you expect from this training?

- Define domestic abuse and common aspects of abuse.
- Develop an understanding of local and national picture and support services.
- Challenge myths and misconceptions around domestic abuse.
- Understand the impact that domestic violence and abuse has on victims and their lives.
- Know how to respond appropriately to any concerns in relation to domestic violence.

Recognising & Responding to Victims/ Survivors of Domestic Abuse

25th April 2024 (1300-1600) TEAMS

Details: This free to attend training course will support practitioners to develop their response to Domestic Abuse in Bedfordshire. This course will be of interest to anyone wishing to further develop their Domestic Abuse practice. You must be working directly with children/ young people/ families/ vulnerable adults in Bedfordshire and already have sound knowledge of the signs and indicators of Domestic Abuse; please complete the free Domestic Abuse eLearning or attend 'Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse' before this course.

What can you expect from this training?

- **Overview:** We will consider how to recognise the signs of domestic abuse & coercive control and look at the tools to help professionals respond appropriately to victims and survivors.
- **Routine Enquiry:** what is it, who should do it, how to do it safely, other considerations (e.g. counter allegations and barriers to disclosure) activity and skills practice.
- Risk Assessment: key risks, signs & symptoms, introducing DASH and case study skills practice.
- Safety Planning: safety planning advice and why it's important.
- Referral Pathway: MARAC/IDVA, Safeguarding, Signposting to national and local resources and overview of BDAP.
- Resources and information: Improved knowledge, skills and confidence to support your practice.
