Midsummer Boulevard East will be transformed into a welcoming festival site, where everyone is welcome to join us as we celebrate midsummer as a time of renewal, healing and good health.

The free programme will be packed with performances, workshops, installations, music, a street food market hosted by Sophie Etc. and much more.



Programme highlights include a newly commissioned work by immersive storytellers Wild Rumpus; Hip Hop maypole mavericks Folk Dance Remixed will be in residence; Thingumajig Theatre will present the otherworldly Ghost Caribou and an evening of contemporary folk will be brought to MK by the experimental music collective Outlands.

Brief

The Midsummer Festival team are looking to appoint MK based creative practitioners and/or cultural organisations to develop and deliver a piece of work or a project, that will temporarily activate a porte-cochère along Midsummer Boulevard East for the duration of the Midsummer Festival 2024.

We are interested in proposals that explore the festival's theme of Summer Solstice.

The porte-cochère's are a unique and iconic part of central Milton Keynes' public realm design – three of which are within the festival footprint.

We welcome proposals from all creative forms including but not limited to:

The porte-cochère takeover should be suitable to engage the general public, spark interest in passers-by and add to their overall Festival experience. Depending on the proposal, the piece could be completed in advance of the Festival and exhibited, or the idea could be a participatory project or activity delivered during the day.

Points to consider

The outcome must have a presence at the Festival on Sunday 23 June 2024, open to the public between the hours of 10:00 and 18:00.

We are looking to move forward with three proposals and an artist can enter more than one idea.

A Festival Producer will work with you to develop your project in the lead up to the Festival but please note, artists will need to be available to set up and manage their porte-cochère throughout the Festival on Sunday 23 June between the hours of 10:00 and 18:00.

The porte-cochère are not load bearing.

Budget: £6,000 to include all project expenses and artist fees.

Deadline for proposals: Midday on Friday 5 April 2024.
