Key themes raised during the consultation period

The area is in need of another primary school that will provide additional places for early years provision and a SEND unit.

Will support the continued growth of this vibrant and growing community.

A new primary school will serve as a further cornerstone for the existing partnerships across the area ensuring children have access to high quality education.

Concern that an additional school in the area will impact further on high volumes of traffic on Barrosa Way and the surrounding areas.

The demographic trends in Milton Keynes mean that fewer primary school places are required, and there are vacancies across primary schools, with numbers below published admission numbers (PAN).

Significant need for special school places with pupils being educated in mainstream provision in settings that are not suitable – it would be better to use the funding to establish/expand a special school. Concern that a small SEND unit will not meet the needs of MK East/MK as there are insufficient places for pupils with SEND.

The consultation closed on 27 April 2025.
