## MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (HIGH STREET (PART), STONY STRATFORD – VINTAGE STONY) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2025

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that Milton Keynes City Council, intends to make an Order under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event, namely the 'Vintage Stony 2026' which is being promoted by Mr. Ray Cobley on behalf of the 'Vintage Stony' Group and the Stony Stratford Business Association. The effect of the Order is to temporarily prohibit all vehicles from entering, proceeding, or waiting along that part of **High Street**, **Stony Stratford** between its junctions with Church Street, and Wolverton Road.

The proposed Order will come into operation on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2026 at 8.00am and will continue in operation for a maximum of 3 days or until the completion of the relevant event, whichever shall be the earlier, however it is anticipated that the restrictions will only remain in effect until 2.00pm on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2026.

The alternative route for traffic will be via Church Street, Silver Street and Horsefair Green (and vice versa).

Pedestrian access to adjacent properties and premises shall be maintained throughout the closure. There shall be no exemptions from the provisions of the order other than for emergency services vehicles and military vehicles.

The closures will be clearly signed in accordance with Chapter 8 of the TSRGD 2016 (The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016).
