Legal Work Experience.

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Purpose	To brief work experience individuals on what to expect during their placement.

Introduction

Your hours for work experience will be 10.00 – 16.00 daily, you are welcome to request an earlier finish time, but we would recommend no earlier than 15.00 to get the most out of this opportunity.

The day will be split into two sessions morning 10.00 - 12.30 and afternoon 13.30 - 16.00 allowing for a 60-minute lunch break.

If you have any allergies or medical concerns that we need to be aware of please notify Siobhan.pitkin@milton-keynes.gov.uk.

On your first day you will be met by John Zammit or Siobhan Pitkin who will take you on a walk of the building, show you the facilities, emergency exits and arrange for an ID pass that will permit you access to the building during your placement. Please ensure that the ID is left with colleagues on your last placement day.

You will receive a laptop for use during your placement, this laptop must not leave the Council Offices and it can be left with John Zammit or legal colleagues at the end of each day. You will be required to carry out relevant mandatory (meta compliance) training on the laptop which will cover Council policies such as Data Security, Computer Use Policy, Email, Equalities, and other areas such as Code of Conduct, Freedom of Information etc.

During your placement you will spend time with each of the four legal teams within the legal department and an afternoon with Democratic Services. Details are set out below.

1. Commercial and Governance

The remit of the Commercial and Governance team:

- Commercial transactions involving the Council.
- Contracts and procurement
- Governance matters, including working with the Head of Democratic Services to ensure that reports put before decision makers have the appropriate legal clearance, providing support to the Monitoring Officer and Deputy Monitoring Officers on Code of Conduct matters.
- Information Law

2. Place

The Place team comprises two legal teams: (1) Property and (2) Planning.

The remit of the Property team:

- All property transactions involving the Council, commercial and residential property matters, leases, rights of way, easements, wayleaves, sales, and disposals, including RTBs and other related subjects.

The remit of the planning team:

- All planning, highways and related matters involving the Council, including but not limited to providing legal advice to officers and members either in writing or verbally, including attendance at committees, planning and highways agreements, and regeneration work, including land assembly.

3. Litigation

The remit of the Litigation team:

- Civil and criminal litigation, general litigation, including housing law, planning, highways, property, etc.
- Regulatory law, including licensing and attendance at licensing committee meetings.
- Employment law
- Advocacy
- Overseeing the arrangement for dealing with insurance claims.

4. Social Care

The remit of the Social Care team:

- All aspects of Children and Adult Social Care legal work, including case working and advocacy, and education matters.

Please note that due to the nature of legal practices, at times colleagues allocated to spend time with you may be required to action urgent and time sensitive matters. If this is the case, the department will do their utmost to find a colleague to cover, however, there may be times where this is not possible. We encourage you to speak to the next available colleague if you are ever without work or left unaccompanied for short periods without pre-agreement. Legal Business Support

The Legal teams are supported by a team of business support officers led by Siobhan Pitkin.

Democratic Services

The Democratic Services team sits under the Law & Governance Directorate alongside Legal. This team oversees, Councillor Support & the Civic Office, Electoral Services, Committees, Digital Governance and includes Political Assistants. You will spend an afternoon with the team, which will focus on the Constitution and Code of Conduct.
